Campo Di Bocce of Los Gatos

25th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

How do you calculate the countless love affairs with bocce that Campo di Bocce (CdB) of Los Gatos has spurred, because a man named Tom Albanese had a brain storm and bought an old lumber yard in downtown Los Gatos, California?

The year was 1997, and Tom Albanese owner and founder of CdB had a vision and that vision earned him a place on the United States Bocce Federation's Wall of Honor. Not for his bocce skills, but for his vision, charity, friendship and support to the game of bocce.

The following is from Tom's 2006 Wall of Honor declaration: "His vision in building a first class facility where beginners and experts can enjoy the game and a fine meal has inspired others to continue with the concept, most notably the Palazzo di Bocce in Orion. Michigan." A rare honor Tom received only 9 years from opening CdB.

Campo di Bocce's most successful charity event started in 1998, when he and friend Steve Mariucci, former 49ers head coach collaborated on a tournament to raise money for what turned out to be dozens of charities over the years. Eventually John Madden gave his support to the annual event known for years as the Madden-Mariucci Tournament: Battle of the Bay. Over the tournaments 25 year history it has given over \$8 million to various charities including Special Olympics, Ronald McDonald House and other local charities. Pre-covid CdB hosted 10-12 large fund raisers each year.

One of our favorite days of the year!!! You won't be able to spot them all, but among the local USBF bocce clubs that volunteer to referee the tournament are several former USBF National Championship medal winners. On far right is another Wall of Honor

member from CdB, Michael Nicosia, a 2008 honoree and winner of world and national medals. He is 91 now and still getting out to the courts.



CdB plays host to several leagues including a 16 team senior league, and a brand new Punto, Raffa, Volo league on Sunday mornings. PRV players: Thank you, CdB. If you stop by on a Wednesday night there is a fair chance you might catch Tom Albanese, and Steve Mariucci playing with their league teams.

Back to the earlier question, how many love affairs with bocce has CdB spurred in the Los Gatos and Livermore areas? Players that consider CdB their home court over the years have collected 165 United States Bocce Federation National Championship medals, starting with the first two medals in 1999.

Celebrating CdB's 25th anniversary coincided with the Maureen Albanese Valentine's Day Memorial Tournament, named after Tom's late wife. Twenty-four teams were treated to a great breakfast, an excellent lunch and even better competition.

WHAT IS THE BEST SURFACE FOR BOCCE COURTS IN PUBLIC PARKS?

Many USBF players are interested in finding the best bocce court surface available for public parks. The ideal surface would require no or low maintenance.

The courts where I learned to play, in Scotts Valley, California, are decomposed



granite with oyster shell flour. The oyster shell is becoming more difficult to find for environmental reasons, and much effort is required to keep the courts playable, especially after rains in the winter. We are currently researching a synthetic surface that is durable enough for year-round use outdoors in a public park.

Synthetic surfaces have improved over the years, but some deteriorate when exposed to sun or rain, or are not easily repaired or replaced when defects become apparent. While some "character" adds to the challenge and unpredictability of the game, the time and expense needed to maintain the playability of the courts in all seasons are critical factors in the choice of court surface.

Although many of the tournaments for the Nationals are held indoors, most of us still play on outdoor courts, which became critical during COVID restrictions. Having a USBF-recommended outdoor synthetic surface that could withstand the weather would be of great value in promoting the installation of new bocce courts in public parks.

If our goal is to promote bocce, creating low-cost access for all would be a great step forward.

Links to online information, PDF's of plans showing the underlying layers and specifying the surface, and the history on maintenance would be greatly appreciated.



Is the Las Vegas 3 on 3 National Tournament Extreme Training for Bocce Players, or a test of our sense of humor?

If you played Las Vegas Tournament (LVT) this last year or any year, while reading this short story, imagine Lou Reed's "Take a Walk on the Wild Side" playing in the background. Why? Because the Las Vegas National Tournament is a walk on the wild side of bocce. If you have yet to play LVT, but plan to, imagine theme song from "Deliverance" playing in background because you are about to get....never mind.

Athletes of all kinds purposefully put themselves in extreme training environments to improve performance under challenging conditions. Runners, cyclist, and even Michael Phelps train at altitudes exceeding 8,000 feet.

Is LVT a bocce player's altitude training? With few exceptions, there are limited opportunities in bocce to experience the rigorous training environment offered by LTV courts. Will LVT improve our long term performance? Sixty-five teams showed up to find out. What do you think? Are the carpets gone from your subconscious mind? Are your balls still five feet short of target? Chances are your balls will not be bouncing off the back wall for a few days at least. All this adjusting from on court surface to another must make us a bit better.

Challenging tournament, and environment? Most definitely. Courts and quality teams make it one of most challenging tournaments available. Playing 3 on 3, 12 balls on the court.....challenging? Yes! Twelve courts, each one distinct. Not unlike 12 different greens on a golf course. Very tough. Teams from all parts of the US, challenging? The best part.

Let's talk about the courts, the world renown, courts.

Concrete floor with carpet squares: It's completely possible the conference room floor was designed and installed by same people that develop tourist attractions called Mystery Spots, Magnetic Hill, Oregon Vortex, promising to show Nature and Physics gone berserk. The tournament organizers have gone to extreme length to provide players with flattest straightest courts possible, but when dealing with the mystery spot odds are not good.

Here is how it works: A coin is flipped, the pallino (P) is rolled straight as an arrow, three quarters down middle of court. Everyone is thinking to themselves: "Wow that's weird. Looks like this court is rolling straight." Following path of P, first ball is rolled straight down the court, heading for certain contact with P. A foot from target, ball takes a sharp left turn for a 16" gap directly left of P (perfect speed, thinks everyone). Second player, having registered the sharp left turn, gauges the speed and rolls. A foot from a certain kiss of the P, the ball takes a sharp right turn, stopping 12" directly right of the P. Being early in first game players reactions are subdued, but the non-verbal response was clear: "Did that really happen?" And, yes it continues to happen for 3 wonderful days of extreme concentration and competition.

There comes a time in ever bocce player's life when they realize the most daunting opponent is the court and not the opposing team. That is what happens each year on a three day weekend in Las Vegas.

Highly recommend playing in this tournament but make sure to bring a sense of humor. And consider hiring a Personal Trainer to build endurance. A 65 team field with a seeding tournament, followed by a double elimination tournament can test anyone's stamina. Teams are promised a minimum of 6 games but falling into loser's bracket or silver division can result in 15 to 16 games. Interviewed a younger participant regarding their teams partying escapades. Answer was not surprising...."we were too tired." Heard another player say "we were so tired by Sunday, the three little pigs could have beat us".

Whether our games will improve from the experience we enjoyed in LV, one thing is certain..... we will be closer to 64 other teams because of the unifying experience groups feel when battling against a common opponent. And it is bocce not world affairs. Maybe Las Vegas generates a new level of Bocce Brother/Sisterhood? Gender Neutral-hood? Who knows? What Rolen Strait knows is "misery loves company" and we all love Las Vegas.



individual members who will be playing in the 2022 Nationals.


